
# Service of Supplication (Moleben) for Christian Unity

# **WEEK OF PRAYER**

**FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY 2019** 











#### Introduction

Welcome to this service of supplication for Christian unity. This Eastern Rite service incorporates the World Council of Churches service for the 2019 Week of Prayer for Christian Unity into the general moleben (or supplicatory service) format as served in Orthodox and Eastern Catholic churches.

The theme for the 2019 Week of Prayer for Christian Unity comes to us from Indonesia: "Justice, and only justice, you shall pursue" (Deuteronomy 16:18-20).

The 2019 theme calls us to move from shared prayer to shared action. Drawing on the traditional values of Bhineka Tunggal Ika (Unity in Diversity) and gotong royong (living in solidarity and by collaboration), Indonesian Christians invite us to be a united witness, and an agent of Christ's healing grace in a broken world, by making specific commitments to justice, equality, and unity.

During the service, participants are called to reflect on how they might commit to a particular act of justice, mercy, or unity, and to write on each of the two provided cards what that concrete commitment is. One of these cards is attached to the person's clothing, and the second will be gathered up as part of the offering and put on an analogion in the centre of the church on which is placed the icon of the crucifixion. At the conclusion of the worship, these cards will be distributed to participants as they leave the church, so that each may pray for another's commitment.

#### **Opening Prayers**

our point of view. In these ways, our attitudes strengthen the dividing walls between us. O Lord, hear us and have mercy.

Presbyter: Again we pray Thee, Gracious God, who hast commissioned us to make our common home a place of justice for all: in Thy generous love, Thou sendest rain on the righteous and the unrighteous and, in Iesus, teachest us to love without discrimination. We confess that we have failed to follow this teaching by: disrespecting neighbours: spreading falsehoods through participating various social media: in disruption of social harmony. Our conduct risks making the world a barren field that no longer brings forth your justice for all of creation. O Lord, hear us and have mercy.

People: Lord, have mercy. (3 times)

Presbyter: Again we pray Thee, O God, the Creator of life, from the islands and the oceans. Throughout the mountains and the valleys, we praise Thee, O God, the Saviour of the world. With the tongues of all nations, we thank Thee, O God, the Comforter of bodies and souls. We come before Thee bearing our burdens and hopes. O Lord, hear us and have mercy.

People: Lord, have mercy. (3 times)

Presbyter: Again we pray Thee, for those who live in the midst of injustice. Encourage us to lift up their voices and strengthen their hope. We pray for those who continue to perpetuate injustice. May Thy kindness fill our hearts and make us agents of freedom and peace. We pray for every institution and person who stands for justice. Let us act justly

according to Thy words. O Lord, hear us and have

mercy.

# **Old Testament Reading (Deuteronomy 16.11-20)**

Presbyter: Wisdom.

*Reader:* The reading from the Book of Deuteronomy.

not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each

according to the measure of faith which God has assigned him. For as in one body we have many

members, and all the members do not have the same function, so we, though many, are one body

in Christ, and individually members one of another. Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, in proportion to our faith; if service, in our serving; he who teaches, in his teaching; he who exhorts, in his exhortation; he who contributes, in liberality; he who gives aid, with zeal; he who does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness. Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; love one another with brotherly affection; outdo one another in showing honour. Never flag in zeal, be aglow with the Spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in your hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints, practice hospitality.

#### Commitment to Justice, Mercy and Unity

The presbyter or other leader says:

To make concrete our individual commitment to work together for justice, you are invited to write your commitment on two separate cards. We invite you to keep one of these cards close to your heart. The second one will be collected and brought forward as an offering.

The people write their commitments on the cards. One or more hymns may be sung to allow the time for this.

# The Symbol of Faith

Presbyter: Let us love one another, that with one mind we

may confess:

People: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit: the Trinity one in

essence, and undivided.

Presbyter: In wisdom, let us attend.

The people sing:

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible.

And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, the only-begotten, begotten of the Father before all ages. Light of Light; true God of true God; begotten not made; of one essence with the Father; by whom all things were made; who for us and for our salvation, came down from heaven, and was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and became man. And He was crucified for us under Pontius Pilate, and suffered, and was buried. And the third day He rose again according to the scriptures, and ascended into heaven, and sits at the right hand of the Father; and He shall come again with glory to judge the living and the dead; whose kingdom shall have no end.

And in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the Giver of life, who proceeds from the Father; who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and glorified, who spoke by the prophets. In One Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church. I acknowledge one baptism for the remission of sins. I look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

another in showing honour, let us ask of the Lord.

People: Grant it, O Lord.

Presbyter: That we, as members of the body of Christ, called

to proclaim the good news to the whole creation, may protect the life and beauty of God's creation, let us

ask of the Lord.

People: Grant it, O Lord.

Presbyter: That our gracious God, who has shown us His

compassion and care for all creation, whose love inspires us to offer these commitments to act justly by loving others wholeheartedly regardless of their cultural, ethnic, and religious backgrounds, may accept now our offerings and transform them into action for the unity of His

Church, let us ask.

People: Grant it, O Lord.

Presbyter: Having asked for the unity of the Faith, and the

communion of the Holy Spirit, let us commend ourselves and each other, and all our life unto

Christ our God.

*People:* To Thee, O Lord.

The commitment cards are placed on the analogion with the icon of the crucifixion.

Presbyter: And make us worthy, O Master, that with boldness

and without condemnation, bound not by chains but by the love of Christ that has been poured into our hearts, we may dare to call on Thee, the
